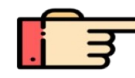

## AGM Highlights.

For those of you that were not able to attend the AGM last week here is a ‘potted’ version of the essential decisions the church made for the future.

- 1) The annual report and financial statement of the past year and the planned budget for the coming year were accepted and approved.
- 2) Proposals for an increase of Senior Elders salary per annum and raising of hourly rate for paid other tasks were approved.
- 3) Action to apply for registration as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation in keeping with current Charitable status regulations and, with it, the necessity of renaming the church, during the course of this year. Plus the decision to employ Stewardship Services to facilitate this with a budget of £3000 was approved.
- 4) A proposal to implement the Roof Project Team’s recommendations and work/financing arrangements were approved. This would be to execute phases 1 & 2 this year, commencing at the end of April. Phase 3 to be started as soon as sufficient funding was raised with the expectation that this would commence this year but possibly not finish until next year. In line with the financing the Elders announced a proposal to have a further Gift day on May 18th.
- 5) A new structure of church Administrative organisation to remove a lot of non spiritual workload from the senior elder was approved. This was to follow the recommendation of a small team working under the authority of an elder for the past few months. This now involves one current elder (Peter Smallridge) forming a team to deal with all the Administrative matters of the church Finance, Maintenance, Website, Communications, Newsletter, Cleaning etc., whilst still remaining an Elder. This structure will be revisited later this year since the new Re-registered Charity, governed by Charity regulations, will require a new constitution to be written
